Good News & Moves

International Day of The Girl UNICEF and partners commemorated the International Day of the Girl on October 11, 2019 with a series of activities organized to amplify the voices of girls and support their rights to a safe quality education. Highlights included school-level mentoring and interactive sessions with newly elected government officials on key issues affecting girls held in 96 schools across seven states and the Federal Capital Territory. Young female professionals and policy makers encouraged young girls with insights to stay in school. The Girls for Girls organization also held a four-day conference in 10 states and Abuja. The National Centre for Women's Development hosted 150 girls to participate in an essay writing competition and speak-out sessions on life and vocational skills.



Monitoring National Learning Achievement Initiative With support from the World Bank, the Federal Ministry of Education is implementing the Monitoring National Learning Achievement initiative across Nigeria. After successful field-testing in Nasarawa and Federal Capital Territory, the study will serve in establishing a national learning benchmark for Mathematics, English and Science.

Good News & Moves (Continued)

Government-to-Government Consultations German International Cooperation hosted government-to-government (G2G) consultations between the Minister of State for Budget and National Planning, Prince Clem Ikanade Agba and Christoph Rauh. The G2G negotiations resulted in new commitments for technical and financial cooperation totaling 70.5 million Euros. Technical and vocational education (TVE) will continue through the ongoing Skills Development for Youth Employment (SKYE) program with a long-term aim of a demand-oriented TVE system to build a workforce whose skills are aligned with the demands of industry and commerce, thus further driving economic development, employment and energy.

Safe Schools Initiative In response to the Chibok mass abduction of schoolgirls and the displacement of thousands of students, Germany continues to support students for the 2019/2020 and 2020/2021 academic years under the Safe Schools Initiative. This effort seeks to improve the safety of students, family members and teachers through the rehabilitation of destroyed schools, the transfer of students from high-risk areas to safe schools in other parts of the country, and the provision of education in camps and communities for internally displaced persons (IDP).



Innovation, Development and Effectiveness in Acquisition Skills (IDEAS) As the World Bank's State Education Programmatic Investment Program ended in October 2019, the Bank prepares to launch the IDEAS project with the aim of improving the relevance of technical skills for labor market entrants in Nigeria. Innovative strategies will enhance the capacity of science and technical college graduates and TVET centers for labor market preparedness.

New Developments...



In November 2019 USAID launched the Reading MATTERS (Mentors, Administrators, Teachers, Texts, Extra Practice, Regular Assessment, Standards) Conceptual Framework highlighting seven components that evidence shows are critical to fostering reading acquisition for all.

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
