The [African Storybook Maker](#) allows you to create storybooks with your own photographs, with photographs of drawings that children have made, or with existing images from the African Storybook website. There is space for a picture and text on each page. It works offline from a tablet or smartphone. When you are online, you can publish your storybook on the African Storybook website.
